- Act as a resource person in matters of addiction prevention among First Nations communities and organizations as well as among partners.
- Support communities in the management of wellness projects (identifying needs, planning, implementation, follow-up, evaluation, etc.).
- Contribute to the development of the skills of workers by offering them training and support based on their needs and by collaborating in the development and adaptation of information and awareness materials and tools.
- Contribute to the implementation and monitoring of regional strategic plans and the development and implementation of local action plans.

- Support the implementation of the First Nations mental wellness continuum.
- Write various reports and documents according to the requirements of the projects and activities.
